



MAGIC 9000 – LONG RANGE TERMINAL WIRELESS COVERAGE & MAPS

- ✍ Wireless is certainly the buzzword for today's business. With respect to Short Range Terminals (those that can operate within 75 metres from a docking station) coverage is unlimited. Also it is important to note, that when a business chooses to accept off-line credit card transactions only (no debit card here) that Short Range Terminals often satisfies their needs with respect to portable payment terminals without nearby docking stations.

- ✍ Truly wireless applications (operating like a cell phone) require the use of Mobitex enabled terminals. (fondly referred to as long range). In Canada, Rogers AT&T operates the Mobitex network, while in the United States Cingular Wireless operates this network. For those customers operating in fringe (coverage) areas throughout parts of the business day, long range terminals usually have the ability to process off-line transactions when coverage is reduced.

- ✍ Mobitex coverage operates seamless to over 93 % of the United States urban business population and most urban business areas throughout Canada. (Coast to Coast).
